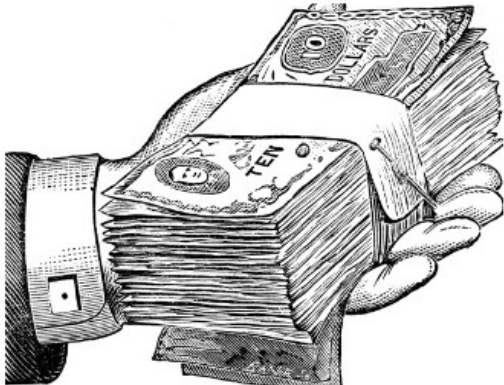

## **SANTA ANITA – 05/09/2026 – ALL NINE WINNERS LISTED IN REPORT!**

**Wow!** The powerful **Trackpro Value Rating (TPV)** algorithm listed all nine winners on the Santa Anita card yesterday, including **FIVE TOP WINNERS** which generated a massive flat bet profit of **+\$11.40** for each two dollars wagered! And not only that, in R4 the **TPV** listed the **#6 BIG SOIREE (19-1)** fourth in the

report marked with a total of four powerful *Handicapping Tools* which paid a whopping **\$41.00** to win! The early listed **50 cent PICK 5 (4 x 3 x 1 x 4 x 1)** returned a very nice **\$855.30** for **Trackpro** subscribers! And the late **50 cent PICK 5 (1 x 1 x 1 x 2 x 1)** listed in the **TOP TWO SELECTIONS** paid **\$512.80!** Nobody hit the listed PICK 6 that now has a carryover of \$43,628 going into today's racing. The late listed **50 cent PICK 4** paid **\$196.75**, and the **\$3.00 PICK 3 (1 x 2 x 1)** paid a rock solid **\$573.60!** **Trackpro** has mentioned many times in

this newsletter that the **TPV** algorithm is not perfect, but overall the **TPV** does an outstanding job of listing **overlooked horses** for subscribers that very often lead to multiple horizontal payoffs that competing websites miss! But the TPV algorithm listed the winner right on TOP to anchor the listed \$3.00 PICK 3 (\$573.60), the listed 50 Cent PICK 4 (\$196.75), and the listed 50 cent PICK 5 (\$512.80)! A perfect example of

exactly what Trackpro is talking about. The TPV selections are definitely unique, make no mistake about that! And the powerful TPV reports sell for a fraction of the cost of the Trackmaster selections to boot!

So the question becomes this: *What did the TPV algorithm do differently from the six competing handicapping services shown above to list the winner in R9*

yesterday at Santa Anita for Trackpro subscribers right on TOP? The answer may lie in the fact that the **TPV** algorithm performs powerful pedigree analysis on every contender in every race, and it is this factor that very often leads to success! In today's edition of the Bloodhorse Daily, author Byron King wrote this about the winner: “*Marjoram's sire Quality Road and her dam Cardamon —a half sister to multiple grade 1 winner Emollient —scored their wins on dirt, and Marjoram showed a high level of effectiveness on the surface in capturing her debut at Churchill Downs last fall. But she's now a grade 3 winner sprinting on grass, just like her older full brother, 4-year-old Spiced Up, winner of last year's Mahony Stakes (G3T) at Saratoga Race Course. Utilizing a come-from-behind style similar to Spiced Up, Juddmonte's Marjoram rallied from last in a field of 3-year-old fillies in the \$102,500 Senorita Stakes (G3T) May 9 to catch favored Light Won Up in the final strides of the about 6 1/2-furlong dash over the hillside turf course at Santa Anita Park. Kicking into gear behind splits of :22.22, :44.93, and 1:07.84, Marjoram hit the wire in 1:13.78 under Juan Hernandez over firm ground. She paid \$9.20 to win. Yours Sincerely rallied wide to show. The victory improved Marjoram to 2-for-3 and represented a bounce-back performance from a troubled fifth-place finish in her lone defeat, an April 4 first-level allowance optional claiming race on grass at Santa Anita that marked her first start of 2026 and her turf debut. "Hats off to Juan and this filly, Marjoram. They were game today," said trainer Michael McCarthy. With the victory, Marjoram became the 100th black-type stakes winner for Quality Road, who stands for \$100,000 at Lane's End in Kentucky.*”

## **PEDIGREE IS A VERY IMPORTANT HANDICAPPING FACTOR**

When **Trackpro** reviewed the race commentary from the Trackmaster competing professional handicapping services shown above, the subject of pedigree is completely absent from the notes, despite the fact that pedigree is an extremely important handicapping factor to take into consideration when handicapping. Read the following snippet taken from my internet research: “*Pedigree is highly important in horse racing handicapping, particularly for 2-year-old races, maiden races, and when horses are switching surfaces (e.g., dirt to turf) or stretching out in distance. It helps identify potential in inexperienced runners, though established form (past performances) usually trumps breeding once a horse has raced several times. Key Aspects of Pedigree Handicapping: **Surface and Distance:** Pedigree is vital for determining if a horse will handle turf or excel at longer distances. **Two-Year-Old / Maidens:** Young horses with little to no race history are often best analyzed through the success of their sire (father) and dam (mother). **The Dam's Record:** Looking at the dam's produce*”

record — what her other foals have done — can be a significant edge. **Sire Stats:** Reviewing statistics for a sire's first-time starters can help identify immediate speed. While it is a powerful tool, relying solely on pedigree is risky, as top-bred horses can fail to perform on the track. Pedigree is best used to complement, rather than replace, analysis of past performance." The **TPV** algorithm takes into consideration the pedigree of every contender in every race, not just the certain types of races that are mentioned above. Why? # TRACKPRO DOUBLE AND TRIPLE OVERLAYS:

## POWERFUL WIN AND PLACE WAGERS!

A **TRIPLE OVERLAY** is defined to mean any horse listed in the fourth position in the Trackpro handicapped report that has a morning line higher than the morning lines on the top three selections combined. For example, if the top selection in the report has a morning line set at 6/5, and the second selection has a morning line set at 6-1, and the third selection has a morning line set at 3-1, and the fourth selection has a morning line set at 20-1, then the fourth selection qualifies as a **TRIPLE OVERLAY**. Why? Because the morning line set at 20-1 is greater than the morning lines on the top three selections combined. Be sure to circle these horses in the daily reports! The win payoff on the #6 BIG SOIREE in R4 at Santa Anita was **\$41.00**, and the place payoff was a rock solid **\$11.20**. The listed \$2.00 **TRIPLE OVERLAY EXACTA KEY** paid a whopping **\$156.40**! Now getting back to the pedigree of the winner, does anyone in the **Turf Club** know anything significant about sire MR. BIG? Well, maybe someone does, but **Trackpro** would have completely looked past this sire had it not been for the outstanding Brisnet Pedigree Ratings! The **TPV** marked the winner #6 BIG SOIREE (**\$41.00**) as a **Pedigree Power Play (=)**! And the **TPV** also marked the winner with three additional *Handicapping Tools*! A standout **Trackpro** LONGSHOT for sure!

**SIRE MR. BIG** - From the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association (2024): "Mr. Big, a stallion George Krikorian developed into one of California's top sires of stakes horses, was euthanized Feb. 27 due to complications from laminitis. Sire of 12 black-type winners, including California-bred champions Big Fish and Ceiling Crusher, Mr. Big was 21. "I'm heartbroken—Mr. Big was a very special horse," Krikorian said. Mr. Big had stood the past two seasons at Pete and Evelyn Parrella's Legacy Ranch in Clements, California, and had just begun the 2024 covering season. "Myself, Evelyn and the entire staff at Legacy Ranch are devastated by this sudden turn of events," Parrella said. "Mr. Big has become a major influence in the breeding industry in California. His loss is not just our loss but a big loss for the entire state. We are honored that Mr. Krikorian had the confidence in Legacy Ranch to have Mr. Big stand here. He's going to be sorely missed." Krikorian has believed in Mr. Big since purchasing him as a weanling

from Viking Stud for \$220,000 at the 2003 Keeneland November breeding stock sale. By champion Dynaformer, Mr. Big was out of the stakes-winning Fappiano mare Fashion Delight, thus representing bloodlines disappearing from current pedigrees. From a racing career limited to nine starts due to injury, Mr. Big won twice at Hollywood Park. He was originally trained by John Shirreffs and later by Bob Baffert after Shirreffs relocated to New York. Under Baffert's tutelage, Mr. Big captured a 1 1/16-mile allowance event with Mike Smith aboard, crushing his competition by 8 3/4 lengths. Krikorian retired Mr. Big to his Kentucky farm in early 2010 and bred him to a few of his mares. His faith in his favorite horse was rewarded when Mr. Big's first foal, Big Break, won for Krikorian first time out by 7 3/4 lengths at Santa Anita. Big Break went on to earn \$236,699 in 42 starts over four seasons. Ceiling Crusher is Mr. Big's leading earner to date, at \$938,400. In 2023, the filly won the Grade 1 Cotillion Stakes at Parx, beating eventual Eclipse Award winner Pretty Mischievous. Earlier in the season, Ceiling Crusher captured the Torrey Pines Stakes, Melair Stakes, and Evening Jewel Stakes in her native California. Sold for \$750,000 at the 2023 Fasig-Tipton Kentucky November sale, Ceiling Crusher just recently was voted the 2023 champion Cal-bred 3-year-old female by the California Thoroughbred Breeders Association. Mr. Big got his first graded winner when Kentucky-bred Big Score won the 2017 Transylvania Stakes (G3) at Keeneland, beating a field that included 2016 Breeders' Cup Juvenile Turf (G1) winner Oscar Performance. Big Score earned \$702,792, won the 2016 Zuma Beach Stakes, and placed in seven other stakes, including the 2017 Hollywood Derby (G1). With that early success, Krikorian moved the stallion to California. "I brought Mr. Big out to California because I thought he'd have a better chance as a stallion," Krikorian said. "And that's what happened." Krikorian-bred Big Fish won the 2020 Del Mar Juvenile Turf Stakes and was named co-champion Cal-bred 2-year-old male of 2020. Other stakes winners soon followed, including \$392,420-earner Big Switch, \$367,958-earner Big Sweep, \$367,958-earner Big Summer, and \$345,770-earner Chancery Way. Mr. Big has been noted for his ability to move up his mares, and has sired 97 winners from 152 starters, with his 12 black-type winners representing 5% of his foals of racing age. He has an incredible lifetime average earnings per starter of \$75,216. The stallion's runners continue to perform well, with Big City Lights winning the Feb. 10 Palos Verdes Stakes (G3) and Big Pond capturing the Feb. 18 Spring Fever Stakes, both at Santa Anita. "We have a lot of horses coming up by Mr. Big that have shown good potential," Krikorian said. "Mr. Big was the special gift that kept on giving."



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
